GUIDELINES FOR SEALS - To qualify for a white, red, blue, or purple seal, a club shall meet the number of guidelines as specified above.

- _____ 1. Turn in Secretary and Treasurer Notebooks plus required review forms.
- _____ 2. Turn in Historian and Reporter Notebooks.
- _____ 3. Have a parent's night or program.
- _____ 4. Plan and carry out one or more group projects such as safety, health, conservation of natural resources (such as wildlife conservation or soil conservation), recreation, people-to-people, emergency preparedness, citizenship, ecology, pollution control, or other similar areas.
- _____ 5. Render some service to the community, such as: present program numbers for another organization, assist persons less fortunate, assist with some worthy cause, help in a community enterprise.
- _____ 6. Have three or more 4-H members participate in a county or district judging school or contest.
- _____ 7. Have an achievement program at a regular or special 4-H meeting to bring the accomplishments of the club and of the 4-H members to the attention of the people in the area.
- _____ 8. Hold a club project tour or a local club fair.
- _____ 9. Present one or more demonstrations or illustrated talks in a county contest.
- _____ 10. Have a window display promoting some phase of 4-H work.
- _____ 11. Have a booth at the county fair or a county 4-H show promoting some phase of 4-H work.
- _____ 12. Have a 4-H float in a parade.
- _____ 13. Have an exchange meeting or other event with another 4-H Club in the county or in another county.
- _____ 14. Participate in a 4-H Sunday or 48 Hours of 4-H observance.
- _____ 15. Have a 4-H member participate in a county camp or day camp.
- _____ 16. Have a 4-H member participate in two or more county events not included in any other guideline such as Style Revue, Tractor Safety Course, Dog Show, Spring Garden and Flower Show, Favorite Food Show, or other similar events.
- _____ 17. Have some exhibits from your club at the Kansas State Fair in the current year.
- _____ 18. Have a majority of the officers attend a 4-H officer training.
- _____ 19. Make a membership contribution to the Kansas 4-H Foundation.
- _____ 20. Make a contribution to a county fund, such as a contribution to the Cancer, March of Dimes, Tuberculosis, Heart, Muscular Sclerosis, or similar drives.
- _____ 21. Increase the number of 4-H members in the club by 5%.
- _____ 22. Present a radio program or create a You-Tube video on 4-H and publish on the county 4-H Facebook page.
- _____ 23. Have one or more older 4-H members attend a training meeting for camp counselors, camp program assistants, and/or junior staff members and assist with a day camp or the county camp.
- _____ 24. Take an educational one-day trip or tour.
- _____ 25. Visit people in a rest home and/or provide a program or programs and remembrances for them.
- _____ 26. Plan and present a model meeting during the current year or participate in a meeting evaluation by an outside reviewer.
- _____ 27. Complete any two self-determined goals. List Goals:
- _____ 28. Have at least 25% of club members complete and submit Kansas Project Record Form.

- _____ 30. Have at least one member or adult representative attend the majority of the county 4-H Council meetings.
